

Code of Conduct:

For visitors to Beechwood, the National Cemetery of Canada

The following code of conduct for group visits has been devised for the safety of the groups themselves and the general cemetery visitors.

- Beechwood Cemetery's tour program operates within a working Cemetery, and as such the tour route may be subject to change. It is requested that respect for the privacy of those attending funerals and cremations is shown. All forms of discourteous behaviour are not permitted.
- During the Cemetery Tour it is essential that the group remain together and with the tour guide at all times and comply with the safety instructions set out by the guide at the start of the Tour.
- For the safety and security of your group please keep to the foot paths at all times. During school trips, students must be supervised at all times by a teacher when in Beechwood Cemetery. Teachers must be clearly identifiable.
- The Cemetery Tour is approximately one hour and thirty minutes in duration. All visitors are encouraged to wear appropriate clothing and footwear, particularly if the weather is likely to be inclement.
- The consumption of food, drinks (other than water) and chewing gum during the Cemetery Tour is forbidden.
- All mobile phones must be turned off during the guided Cemetery Tour
- Should a behavioural problem arise, it will initially be addressed by the tour guide. If the problem persists, the group leader /teacher in charge will be requested to deal with the situation. Persistent disruptive behaviour will result in the termination of the entire visit.
