





The RCMP National Memorial Cemetery at Beechwood

The RCMP (originally the North West Mounted Police) and Beechwood Cemetery were established in 1873 and have grown to become two of Canada's most respected institutions.

In 2001, the RCMP Veterans' Association (RCMPVA) Ottawa Division researched the possibility of establishing an RCMP cemetery in Ottawa, the birthplace of the original Force. Following a bilateral agreement signed by the RCMPVA and Beechwood, the official opening of the RCMP Memorial Cemetery occurred in October 2004.

In 2006, the RCMP joined the partnership and the site was officially named the RCMP National Memorial Cemetery at Beechwood.

The RCMP National Memorial Cemetery at Beechwood complements the RCMPdesignated cemeteries at Depot Division in Regina, Maple Creek and Battleford in Saskatchewan, and Fort Saskatchewan in Alberta









Eligibility

ELIGIBILITY INCLUDES:

The RCMP National Memorial Cemetery at Beechwood is open to:

- current RCMP employees,
- members of the RCMP Veterans' Association (RCMPVA), and
- those who may meet the criteria of the RCMP Veterans' Association, and
- their respective families.















A Place for Generations

Beechwood has dedicated a plot of land with over 4,000 gravesites and two granite walls with the capacity to hold thousands of niches in the years ahead. Beechwood provides a dedicated family services representative to help families make the right decision for their loved ones.

Ground Interment

Families have the option of both casket burial and/or urn interment with up to eight urns per grave. Each location is designed to accommodate an upright monument with the RCMP badge and surname, service dates, and regimental numbers prominently placed at the top. Monuments can be constructed in a variety of colors and designed to allow eight or more names, enabling multiple generations of casket or cremation burials in one location.

Columbarium Niches

Beechwood has constructed two granite columbaria for families choosing above-ground inurnment. Each location has room for two urns, with identification placed prominently at the top on a bronze plaque along with the RCMP badge.

First, cremation or casket burial? This choice is very personal and it is best to make it with your loved ones. Beechwood Cemetery's knowledgeable family service representatives will provide you all the information that you may require to make an informed decision.

- 1. Granite niche front
- 2. Urn
- 3. Inurnment (Opening-and-Closing)

INSCRIPTION

All inscriptions on the RCMP NMC monument can vary, however the following is commonly found:

- RCMP Ensign or badge of another service which you have served in;
- Your name, rank, service and regimental number, and dates;
- Your next of kin's name, rank (if applicable) and dates; (this varies depending on size of lot and monument)
- Ensign or badge of next of kin (if applicable) or approved religious symbol.











A Place for Generations to Commemorate

To commemorate the founding of the RCMP (NWMP) on May 23, 1873, the RCMP Veterans Association – Ottawa Division holds an annual sunrise vigil.

On May 23, a bugler and a piper from the RCMP Pipes and Drums start the vigil, calling serving members and veterans to participate in a sunrise Flag raising ceremony at the Main Monument recalling their basic training at Depot and to stand in repose at the Fallen Member Cenotaph from 06:00 hrs until the memorial services at 11:00 hrs. . Wreaths are placed to remember those who have served Canada diligently and their families who supported them.

Tours are provided to show respect to the over 250 North West Mounted Police, Royal North West Mounted Police, and Royal Canadian Mounted Police members buried across the National Cemetery of Canada. These were some of the members who each shaped the Force in their own way.

A Remembrance Ceremony is help prior to Remembrance Day (November 11) to honour the service of the military and para-military of the RCMP, RCMP Veterans and their families.
